Hello all,

This month, I have been busy on my wards, paying particular attention to those villages that have been targeted by nuisance motorbikes. I have been working with my colleague PCSO Brooks from the Neighbourhood Task Force, who has been managing a *Problem-Solving Package* to tackle this across the district.

The village of Pluckley, has seen a group of youths riding around and causing damage to the local football fields. I have been working in partnership with the Parish Council and have been able to obtain some video footage of persons committing these offences. The investigation is ongoing and I'm keen to educate and deal with those committing such offences.

This month I have been able to attend Parish council meetings at both Aldington and Pluckley, I have also carried out some community events across my wards. I appreciate the warm welcome that I received at the Wye Christmas Street party, where I met several local business owners, parish councillors and members of the public. It was an enjoyable event, and it was nice to see so many in attendance and the community coming together.

I attended a call in Smeeth following a report of a suspicious package. The packages were linked to a stolen delivery vehicle from the Romney Area, due to the prompt call from a member of the community I was able to attend and secure the parcels and delivery bags. This just shows how important it is to let us know if something doesn't look quite right. Finally, I have conducted a leaflet drop in Wye, in relation to My Community Voice. MCV is a two-way engagement tool to help me understand the needs of the community. Let's get as many people signed up as possible so that we can strengthen our community with effective communication!
