#### **Winter Heating Subsidy Scams**

Criminals are actively using both text messages and emails to try and steal bank details by playing on older people's concerns about the Winter Fuel Payment.

The emails and texts will ask you ask you to click on a link, however, the link does not redirect you to the UK Government website or anything to do with Winter Fuel Payments and instead takes you to a realistic website under the control of the criminals, where they will steal your personal and financial data.


Most eligible recipients will get the Winter Fuel Payment automatically. You should have received a letter in the post between October and November stating how much you will receive. If you think you are eligible but have not heard anything, then check this Government Web Page to find out more Winter Fuel Payment: Eligibility - GOV.UK


