#### Number 10 of the 12 frauds of Christmas - QR Codes

Over November/December 2023, three quarters of a million pounds was lost to OR fraud.

What is a OR code scam?

A QR Code Scam is a deceptive practice where fraudsters exploit QR codes to perpetrate fraud and steal personal information. Typically, these scams involve the creation of counterfeit QR codes that, when scanned, redirect users to fraudulent websites.

Remember, Never Assume or Believe something is genuine and always Confirm before clicking a link or scanning a QR code.

Pause before you scan or click.

#### **Fake Compensation Email**

Over 4,800 people have reported receiving FAKE emails claiming that diesel car users are eligible for thousands of pounds in compensation and asking them to click on a link.

However, by clicking a link the victims were taken to a realistic looking website under the control of the criminals, where they stole their personal and financial
