Number 4 of the 12 frauds of Christmas – Hacking

Email and social media hacking is the most reported form of cybercrime in the UK.

This Christmas, secure your accounts:

Use three random words to create a strong password.

Enable 2-step verification (2SV).

Investment Scam

HSBC has reported a 'deepfake' video circulating on social media using HSBC's name to push a bogus investment opportunity.

The scam video appears to feature a broadcast journalist delivering news of 'easy returns' from 'Alpowered investment' software. While this might appear genuine, it has been confirmed as a fake.

Some things to bear in mind:

- Be wary of promises of 'quick and easy earnings.'
- Always carry out your research.
- Never click on suspicious links or deals that appear too good to be true.

Criminals are using ever more sophisticated technology to trick victims. Banks do have robust systems in place to counter any threat. However, always remain cautious and report any suspicious financial activities.
